# Academic Statistics for School Year 2021-22

### Advanced Placement (AP) Information & Results - May 2022

- In 2022, a total of 407 AP examinations were administered to 165 students.
- Of the 165 students, there were 85 seniors, 54 juniors, 3 sophomore, and 25 freshmen
- 88 students from the Class of 2023 have enrolled in 1 or more AP courses during their 4 years of high school
- 63 students from the Class of 2023 have enrolled in 2 or more AP course for their senior year
- Saint Joseph High School expects all students enrolled in AP courses to take the corresponding test
